

We're Here for Good



Over the past six years, Project 82 Kenya has flourished into a ministry that serves the children of all ages in Kenya. We exist in response to God's call to love, care and serve orphans and vulnerable children by nurturing them holistically to achieve sustainable family solutions. It's our mission to provide strong, promising futures for the children of Kenya for generations to come.

In Kenya, communities struggle to care for the **2.5 MILLION ORPHANS** among them.



MOLO CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

Project 82's child sponsorship program provides basic needs, medical care, education fees, required school uniforms and spiritual guidance to over 180 children living in the Molo community. This program is unlike any other child sponsorship ministry, as our commitment to these children doesn't end when they turn 18. Project 82 Kenya ensures that children only graduate from our program when they have completed a four year university, two year college, or trade school. This ensures that they will become self-sustaining adults, and our hope is the next generation of children will have a better chance of breaking the chain of poverty.

INFANT RESCUE PROGRAM

Hundreds of newborns are abandoned on the streets or in hospitals every year in Kenya. The reasons they're left alone vary, but they are never abandoned by the volunteers and mentors of Project 82. Neema House – Neema means "grace" in Swahili – in the Nanyuki community graciously takes in these babies and provides them food, shelter, healthcare and a living environment. Whether we reunite them with their biological family or locate an adoptive or foster family in Kenya, we strive to find every baby a place to belong and call home.

GUARDIAN PROGRAM

In Kenya, some will take in abandoned children into their community. These individuals are generally single women and are referred to as Guardians. They often find it difficult to care for the orphans and their families. Our Guardian program not only empowers these local guardians to care for the orphans, but helps them learn new life skills that can be used to sustain their families for the long-term.

Successes from 2015

BELOW ARE SOME STATISTICS THAT SHOW WHAT GOD HAS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2015.


- We're currently providing care to over **180 CHILDREN** in Molo and over **27 INFANTS** at the Neema House.
- Out of the 20 older children in Molo, 85% have progressed to secondary school, receiving the skills and education to become self-sustaining. **13 ARE ATTENDING TRADE SCHOOL** and **4 ARE ATTENDING A UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE.**
- We now have **40 OF OUR 50 GUARDIANS SELF-SUSTAINING**, thanks to the guidance of Project 82.
- Since January 2013, we have served 52 babies in our Neema House. Of those 52, **19 HAVE BEEN REUNITED WITH THEIR BIOLOGICAL FAMILIES**, 6 have been adopted by Kenyan families, and 1 has been placed with our first foster care family.




TOTAL MINISTRY EXPENSES FOR MOLO AND NANYUKI

The Future of Project 82 Kenya





